The Paw Paw Downtown Development Authority works towards enhancing the downtown area by maintaining buildings and their facades. With the facade grant and loan program that the DDA provides, businesses in Paw Paw's downtown can get assistance repairing, constructing, or reconstructing exterior elements of a building such as windows, doors, exterior walls, chimneys, or any other architectural fault. These building and restoration projects preserve the vintage structures of downtown while helping build and improve new ones, ensuring that Paw Paw's downtown remains beautiful.

In the past fiscal year, the DDA has approved 11 grants and paid out on 7 grants. The total pay out YTD is \$16,058.50. Over the course of eleven years, we have awarded approximately \$1,161,090.61in downtown business support grants.

Grants are available for up to \$5,000 (matching funds) to downtown businesses for facade work to downtown district buildings. Go to www.UncorkPawPaw.com for more information.

# WINE AND HARVEST & FIREWORKS SHOW

In 2019, the Wine and Harvest Festival helped to draw over 50,000 people to the community. The DDA continues it's sponsorship of the Wine and Harvest Festival fireworks show and a portion of the promotional materials. The fireworks are a huge draw for visitors and residents alike and the 2019 show was nothing less than spectacular! The State estimates that each visitor spends \$70 per day and those staying overnight spend even more. The festival fills all three hotels both Friday and Saturday nights of the festival. Based on that statistic, the festival would have an economic impact of \$3.5 million on this community overall.

Over 25 non-profit organizations participate in some way, keeping their dollars in the community to support their projects.

Many local businesses have stated that Wine and Harvest weekend is their biggest sales weekend of the year.



## **SAFE TRICK OR TREATING**

The DDA and the local downtown businesses host the Safe Treats Trick or Treating event in downtown Paw Paw. The event draws over 900 children and their parents visiting local businesses in the downtown. Even though the weather didn't cooperate last year, the parents and children still enjoyed the experience.

## DOWNTOWN FLOWER POTS AND HANGING BASKETS


The DDA continues to find ways to beautify the downtown business district. We work collaboratively with Tuttle Florist and Kloosterman Greenhouse, to fill the downtown with beautiful flower pots, hanging baskets and flower beds located in the downtown district.

## **PROGESS BEGINS AT 210 E. MICHIGAN AVENUE**

The Barton Group is working on this \$1,276,276 project which is being partly funded by a Community Development Block Grant from MEDC of \$584,183 and a Revolving Loan Fund contribution of \$86,000 from the county. The project will include the creation of retail space on the first floor and four, 2-bedroom apartments on the second floor. These improvements will remove blight, improve economic activity in the downtown, and provide additional housing opportunities. The new roof has been installed, abatement/ demolition is complete and waiting for contractor mobilization.



## **RIVER TRAIL MAINTENANCE**

The DDA donated to the maintenance of the Paw Paw River Water Trail project. This trail connects to Maple Lake where the village installed a new kayak launch this past year.

## **PAW PAW IS GOING GREEN**

The Village is now collecting rain to be used in watering the downtown flowers. Just 1/10 inch of rain on a 1,000 sq. ft. roof can fill a 60-gallon rain barrel. Over the course of a year, 1 barrel will help reduce water use by about 1,400 gallons.
